In recognition of the fact that Western's secondary teacher education program is a shared, University-wide enterprise in which secondary teacher candidates complete a professional education program through the Woodring College of Education and an endorsement program offered by academic departments, The ACC hereby instructs Secondary Education and other academic departments involved in Western's secondary teacher education program to reaffirm, honor, and uphold, for current and future students, the curricular authority and standards of academic departments charged with oversight of subject area endorsements. Secondary Education should advise current and future students who may seek endorsements offered under the curricular authority of other academic departments to contact department advisors and/or chairs responsible for the endorsements they seek (see https://wce.wwu.edu/cert/endorsements). Students may also be apprised of endorsement avenues provided by the State of Washington. Students who believe they have been adversely impacted by advising or published Catalog language suggesting that Secondary Education can provide subject area endorsements on the basis of curricular standards other than those established and overseen by the appropriate academic departments should be advised to pursue the University's standard grievance procedure with the Registrar.
