CUE Committee Meeting Minutes of November 16, 2023

Meeting Location: Old Main 340

CUE Chair Reid Dorsey-Palmateer called the meeting to order at 4:03, welcoming a total of 15 attendees (roster attached).

Discussion Item

PEJ Task Force Representative: Chair Dorsey-Palmateer introduced and gave a background about what the PEJ Task Force is and what they will be taking a look at. He then mentioned that there is one committee member slot for a CUE committee representative. He asked for a volunteer but no one came forward. So he said that if anyone has an interest but need more information to feel free to contact him by email.

Recommendations to follow up from ACOM assessment: Chair Dorsey-Palmateer presented the draft document regarding the results of the ACOM assessment with some further result breakdowns by group. What are some ways that our 101 writing program can improve? One proposal is the library offering a concurrent support class to those who need it, LIBR 139. It would be a similar set up to the example of the current math support program of the class MATH 109 which student take concurrently with MATH 112 which supports their learning. The committee then discussed how to know if this model actually helps students, how do we measure the effectiveness to make a case for further funding? Possibly a waitlist to be able to compare to or a paired course comparison, but no decision was reached. Moving forward plans are that Shannon and Shevell from the library will work up a draft budget so there are some numbers to start further discussions with. Then AVP Herring will look at funding the sections associated with First Gen/Low income students with money from his area and talk to ESS about funding the other sections with enrollment fee dollars.

Should WP points be awarded for classes where writing component was failed: Chair Dorsey-Palmateer brought up this issue from a college about when a class has a writing component and the student passes the class but failed the writing section. How should that situation be handled? Committee members asked how widespread of a problem is this? They discussed maybe separating out the writing component credit from the class (4 credit class = 3 credits for class and 1 for writing component). Another idea was maybe having the instructor put in their syllabus that passing the writing component is necessary to pass the class.
