
Digest of Changes to the Faculty Handbook: Section 1 (Constitution)

PRESENTED TO FACULTY SENATE APRIL 8, 2024 BRANDON DUPONT

Proposed Revision

- Combine into one handbook, deleting all but three appendices, referring to policies that exist elsewhere
 - Preface: Based on Current Handbook Passed Faculty Senate on 02/26/24
 - Section 1: Constitution & Bylaws of Faculty Senate & Senate Standing Committees
 - Section 2: Statement on Academic Freedom
 - Section 3: Code of Faculty Ethics





Substantive Changes To Constitution

Article Three: Faculty Senate

3.1

Adds collaboration with other campus units on budgeting, planning, and policy

3.2 - Membership

- Clarifies that voting members of Senate are those faculty elected by colleges
- Lists non-voting members and adds AS representative to this list
- Clarifies that chairs of standing committees are not (necessarily) Faculty Senate members

3.3 – Terms of Office

- Adds that Senate approves Committee rosters
- Adds that Senate vacancies that may arise during the year can be filled by a vote of Exec Council rather than full Senate, upon referral of names from college governance bodies

Article Four: Officers of the Faculty Senate

4.2 – Primary Duties and Terms of Office

Primary duties language replaces sections 4.6 – 4.9 (details/duties will be in bylaws)

4.3 - Election

Adds language stipulating use of secret ballot whenever there are multiple nominees for a position

Article Five: Faculty Senate Executive Council

5.1 – Membership

- Clarifies voting/not voting status, moving Faculty Legislative Rep to non-voting to be consistent with Budget Rep/Deputy Budget Rep
- Only voting Executive Council members are Senate officers
- Adds UFWW president as non-voting member (not listed in current)

5.3 – Duties

Updates to current practices

5.7 – Actions

Requires four of the five voting members present for quorum

5.8 - Schedule

Adds that Senate Exec meets regularly on alternating Mondays.

Article Six: Amendments


6.1

- Creates a 2/3 threshold for approving Constitutional amendments
- Removes reference to Board of Trustees role on amendments (BOT consulted and approves language)

Article Seven: Ratification

7.1

- Creates a 2/3 threshold for ratification
- Removes reference to Board of Trustees role on ratification (BOT consulted and approves language)
